For monitoring and administering the claim management process of **Iris Prolapse- repair, Secondary IOL/ IOL exchange/ explant, Endophthalmitis (excluding Vitrectomy), Scleral Fixated IOL (SFIOL) (including vitrectomy)**, NHA shall be following these guidelines. This document has been prepared for guidance of PROCESSING TEAM and TRANSACTION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM of AB PM-JAY for the claims of procedures mentioned above. The hospitals can also refer to this document so that they have the insight on how the claims will be processed. However, this document doesn't provide any guidance on clinical and therapeutic management of patient. In that respect the hospitals and physicians may refer to any other relevant material as per the extant professional norms.

PART I: Guidelines for Clinicians and Healthcare Providers

1.1 Objective:

The purpose of this section is to act as a tool for hospitals for selection of corresponding Health Benefit Package and to determine and submit the mandatory documents required for claiming reimbursement of health benefit package under PMJAY.

1.2 Mandatory documents- For healthcare providers

Following documents should be uploaded by the concerned hospital staff at the time of pre-authorisation and claims submission:

PART II: GUIDELINES FOR PROCESSING TEAM

2.1 Objective: To provide guidance to the pre-authorisation and claims processing team in ascertaining the medical necessity of procedure carried out vis a vis the patient's medical condition as evidenced by supporting documents/investigation reports etc, in deciding the admissibility and quantum of claim and compliance with mandatory documents by the hospital.

2.2 Following mandatory documents to be diligently reviewed by the pre-auth / claims processing personnel:

Iris Prolapse Repair, Secondary IOL/ IOL exchange/ explant, Endophthalmitis (excluding Vitrectomy), SFIOL (including vitrectomy)

2.2.1 At the time of pre-authorization processing- For pre-authorisation processing doctor (PPD):

- Clinical notes, documentation of pre-operative eye examination supporting indication for intervention? yes



- b. Clinical Photograph of affected part with proper labelling (L/R) with full-face photograph? Yes

2.2.2 At the time of claim processing- For claims processing doctor (CPD)

- a. Is a still image of patient undergoing the procedure with patient ID, date and time available? Yes
- b. Is there a documentary evidence to show that the patient has been examined for any evidence of signs and symptoms justifying the need for surgery for Iris prolapse-Repair, Secondary IOL/ IOL exchange/ explant, Endophthalmitis (excluding Vitrectomy), SFIOL (including vitrectomy)? Yes
- c. Are detailed operative notes available? Yes
- d. Is the detailed patient discharge summary available? Yes
- e. Is barcode of lens available in case of Secondary IOL/ IOL exchange/ explant and SFIOL (including vitrectomy) surgery? Yes

PART III: GUIDELINES FOR IT

3.1 Objective: To enable setting up of cross check mechanisms/rule engines within the IT platform (TMS) to ensure compliance with STGs and to prevent fraud / abuse of the Health Benefit Package.

3.2 Below mentioned are the scenarios where a provision would be built in TMS for pop-ups:

- a. Best Corrected Visual Acuity (BCVA) < 6/9- Yes

Till the time the functionality is being developed, the processing doctors shall check the above manually.
